Mini Grant Proposals - Discuss and sign off

Lori Bramlett and Derek Bowen discussed and signed two mini grant proposals.

One mini grant proposes a STEM K-8 night for gifted students. This is coordinated by Mary Melissa May and the Science National Honor Society. She and her high school student members will design and prepare hands-on demonstrations for K-8 students to explore; engage and inform parents about GHS academic pathways; provide rigorous challenges as part of Academic Achievement. This proposal will also allow for these students to coordinate with members of the community.

The second mini grant proposes a request for funding "High Rigor" for the science department for GHS students in all grade levels. This includes funding for equipment for in-depth labs, access to comprehensive research materials, and continued programs to extend interest and learning in sciences.

Data Visualization in Infinite Campus - Drive Thru

Sometimes teachers may use a gradebook as a classroom management tool, and he can determine this by teacher activity.

These funds will support major projects including the performing arts center construction, renovations to existing facilities, and extensions to classrooms.

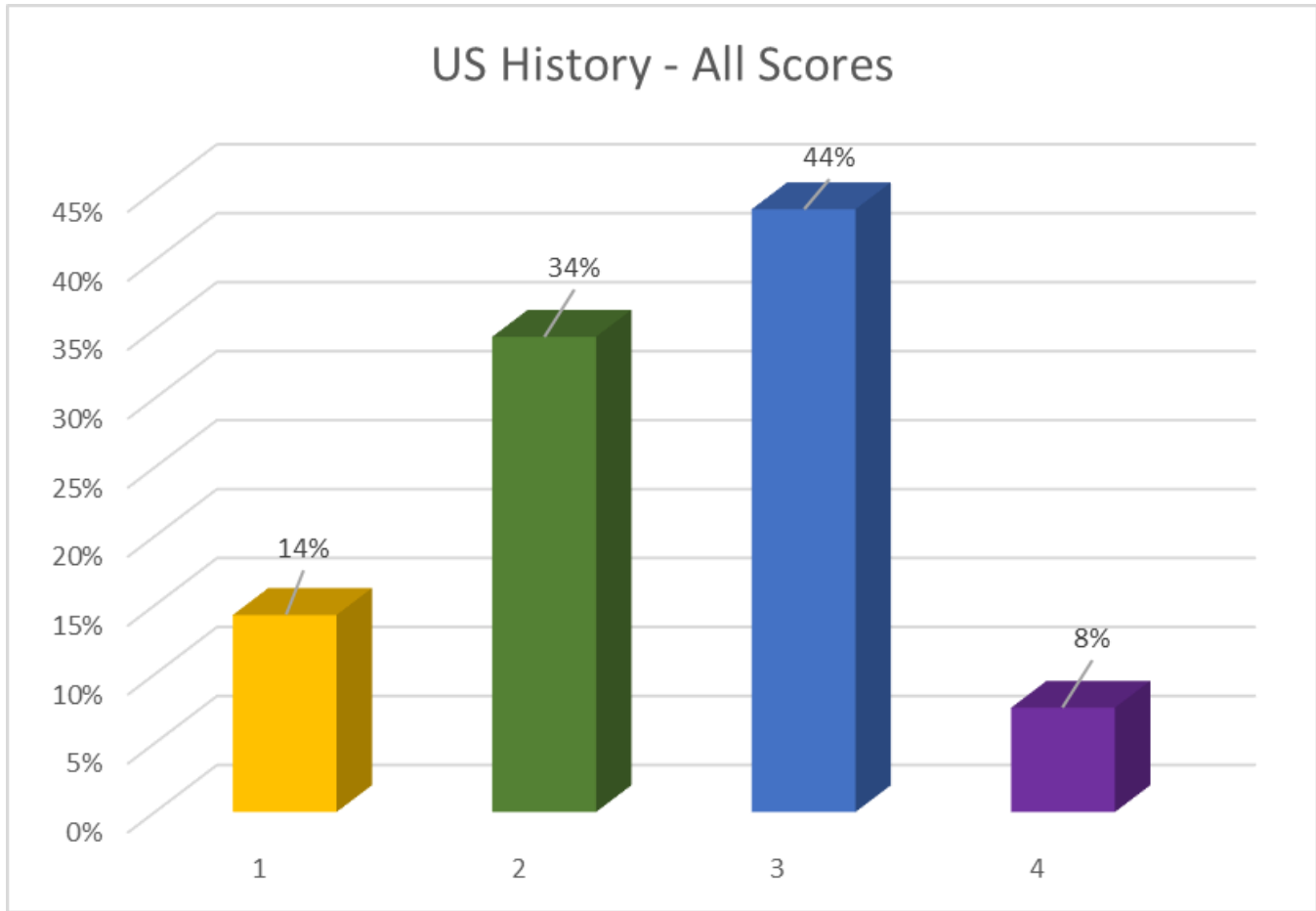

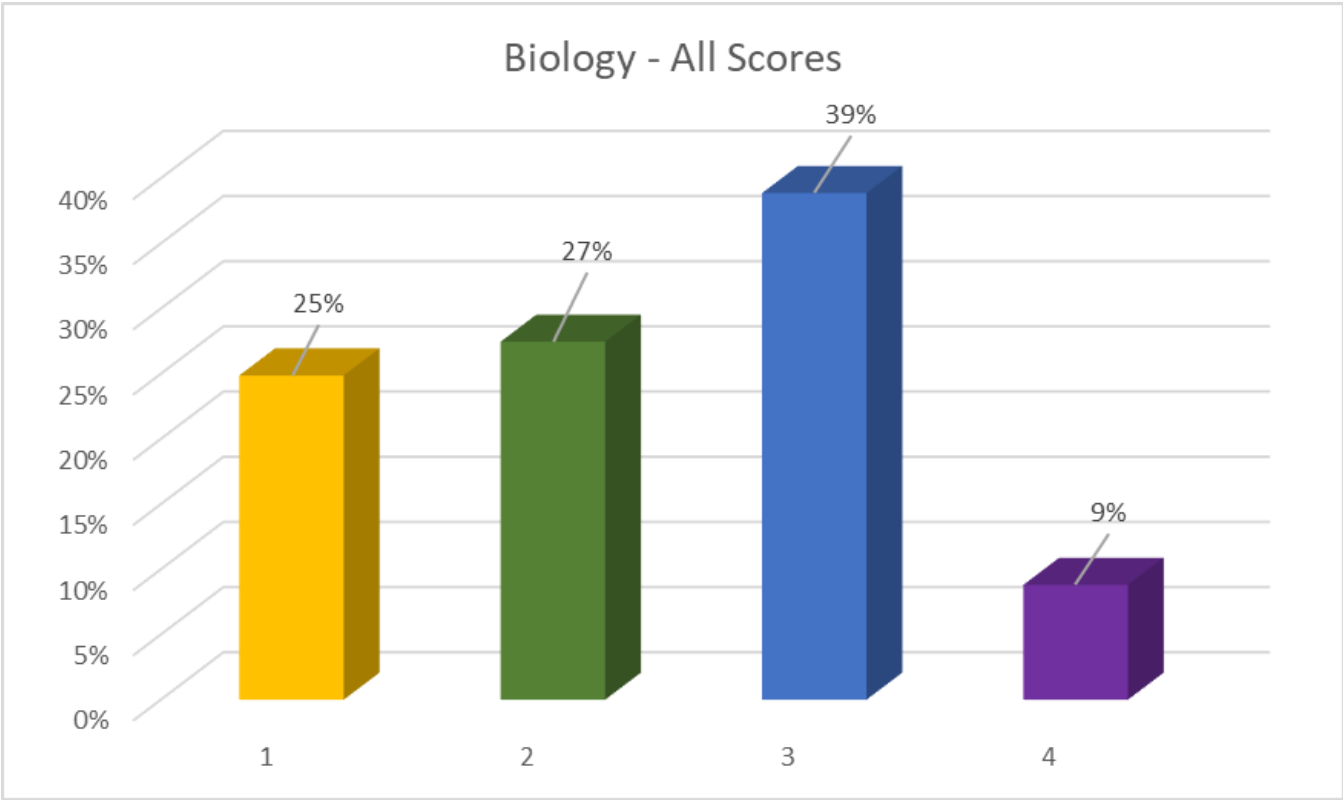

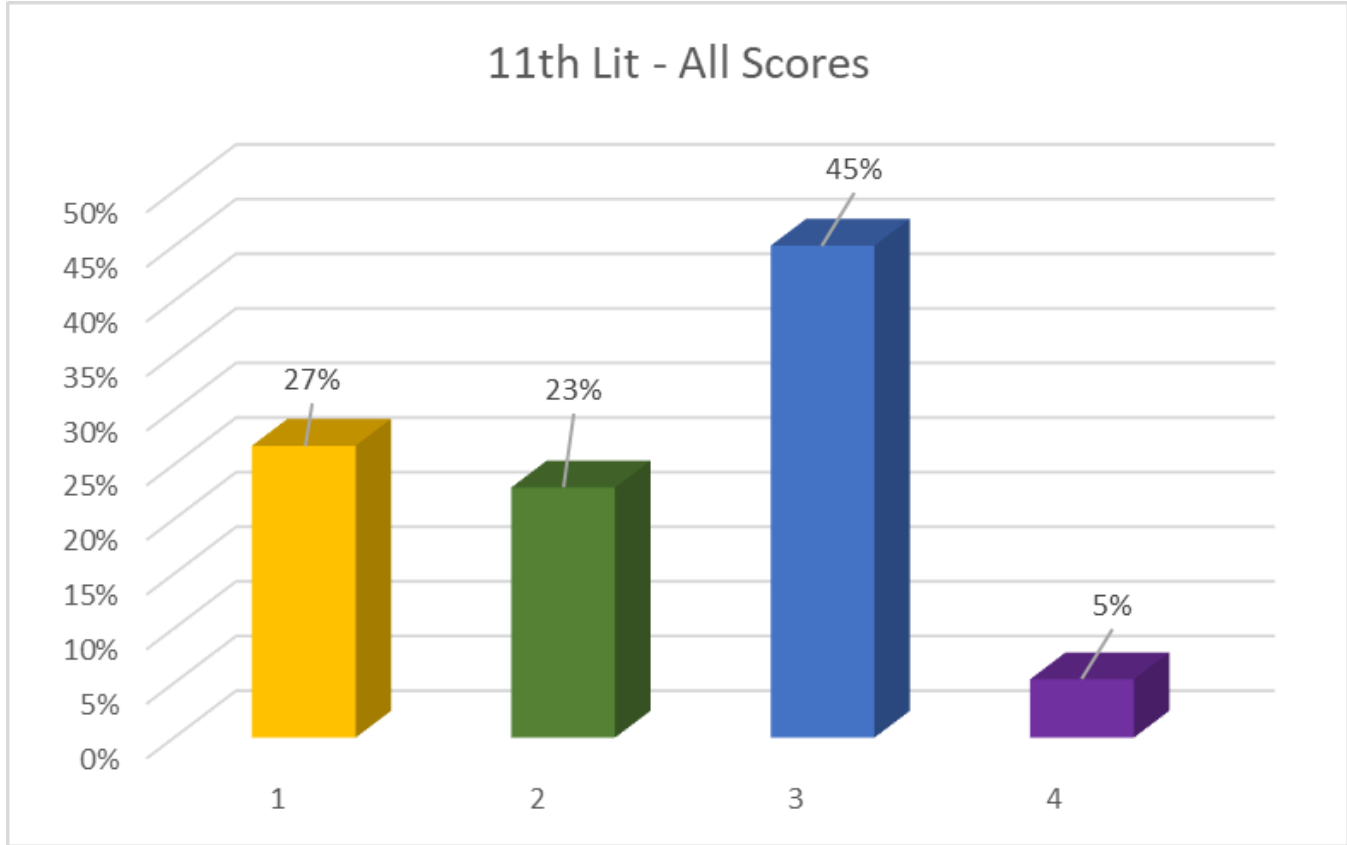

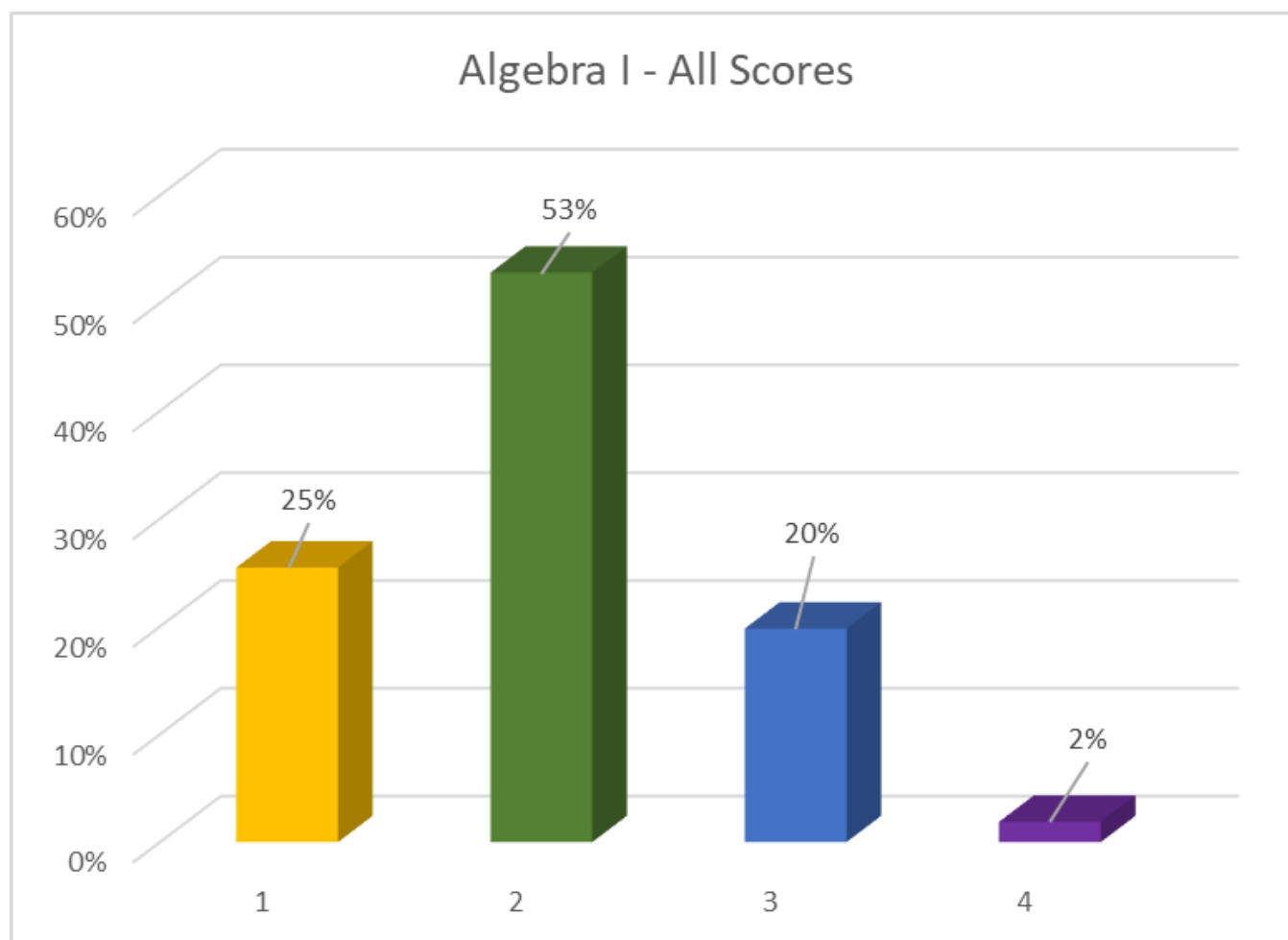

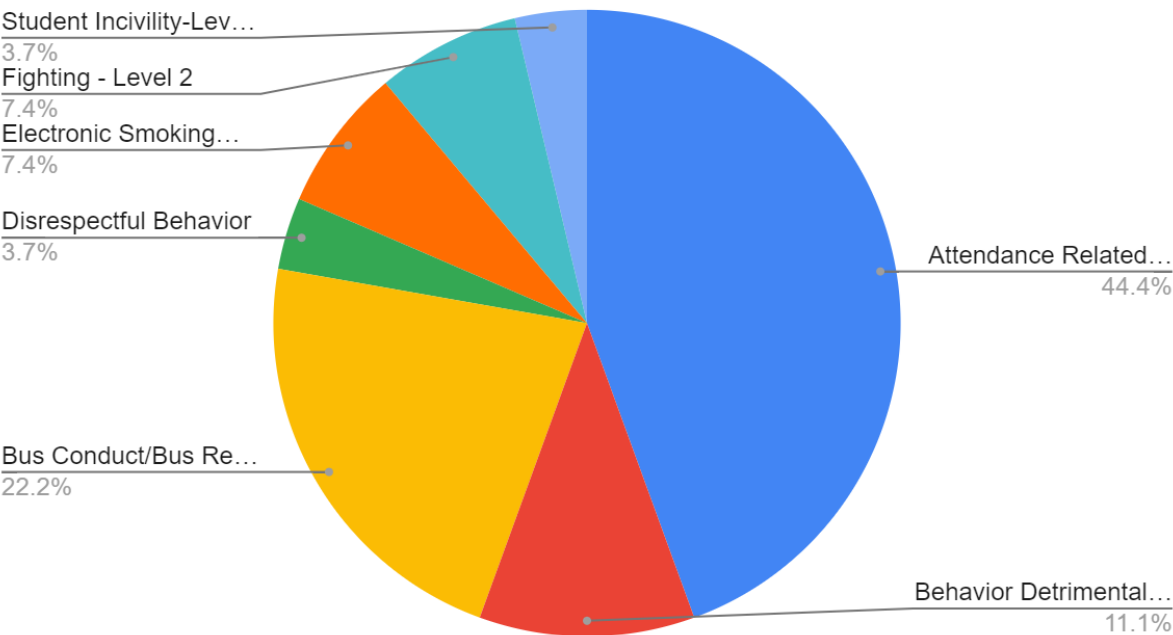

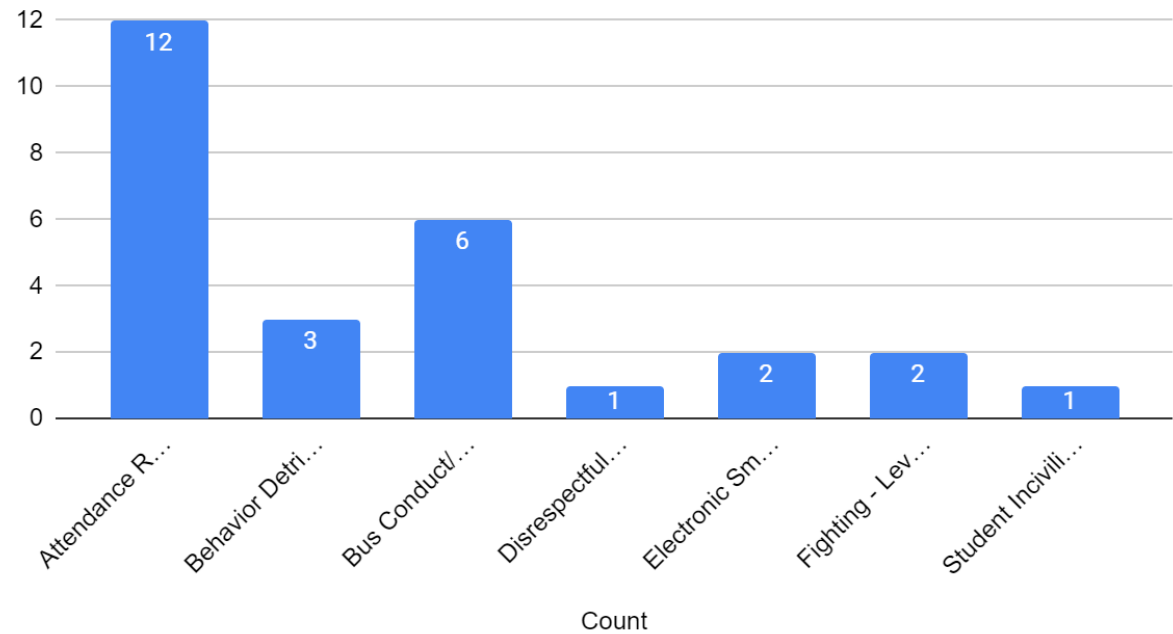

Count of ODRs (December)

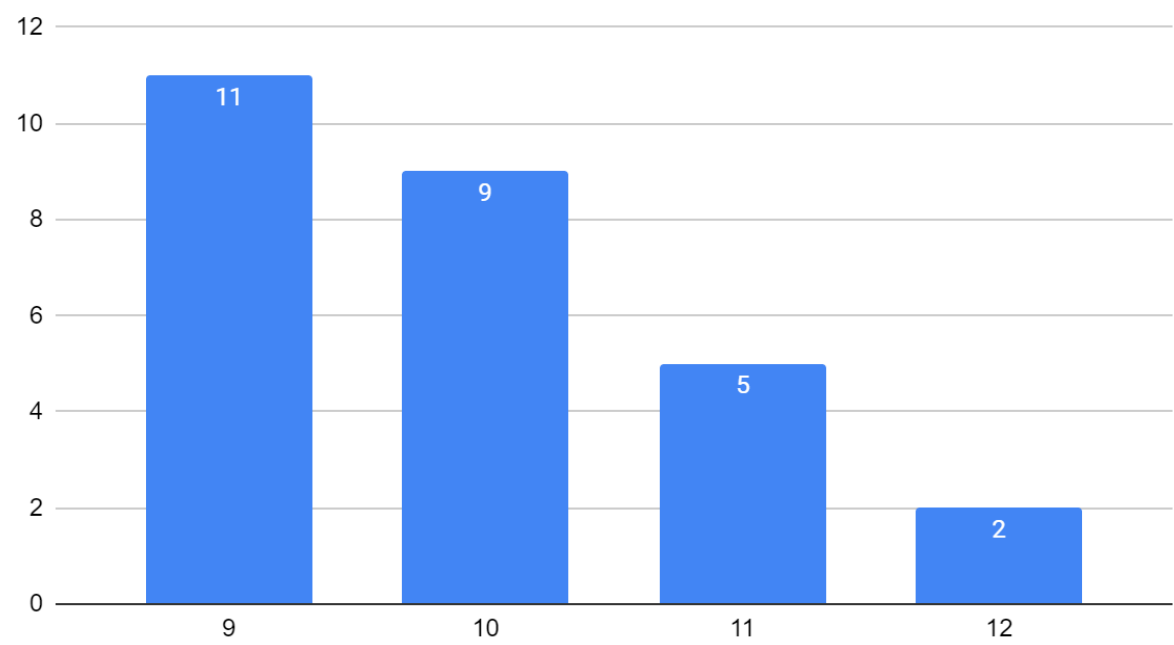
